Partner with ITFM to build a Church / Multipurpose Worship Facility in Nabisooto Village, Uganda.





About Uganda and ITFM:

The country of Uganda is a landlocked area of East Africa and is roughly the same size as the State of Oregon. Countries surrounding Uganda include Sudan, Kenya, Democratic Republic of Congo, Rwanda and Tanzania. For many years Uganda has been described as the "Pearl of Africa" It was once a British territory but gained political independence in 1962. Since that time it has gone through many political challenges. Civil strife and armed conflict have had a devastating social and economic impact on the population. This turmoil along with the spread of disease such as malaria, HIV/AIDS, typhoid etc. has resulted in a country full of orphans, and widows.

In The Field *Ministries* (ITFM) is a North Bend based 501(c) 3 charitable organization which began in 2003 by John and Kimberly Calhoun. ITFM's accomplishments include drilling wells, building pastor housing, an elementary school, teachers quarters and most recently, a clinic. John and Kimberly Calhoun were born and raised in the Snoqualmie Valley and have attended Cascade Covenant Church since 1995.

ITFM purchased a 25 acre site in Nabisooto, Uganda in 2011 and has been making community focused improvements ever since. Thanks to our donors, ITFM has built a secure storage facility / shop as well as caretaker quarters, (Pastor Jackson is living there now) We drilled a bore hole and installed a hand pump giving the local area access to clean water for the first time. We've completed construction on two bathroom facilities and a small clinic with staff housing which we hope to open soon. Our plan is to partner with other Christ centered organizations in an effort to build a church facility on this property that will also be used as a multipurpose building during the week. In this area there is only one Anglican church about 5 kilometers away that is run down and not well attended. Please accept our invitation to partner with us in building this much needed facility and reaching this community in Jesus' name.



ITFM Partnership



Territorial View, Nabisooto

ITFM is all about strategic community improvements such as fresh water, education and health. Part of our community outreach focus includes building a church facility on these 25 acres in Nabisooto. In The Field Ministries' main focus is to improve the community as a whole. We can help by providing education and healthcare but without Jesus, they don't mean much. When you provide for these basic needs, people become more spiritually receptive. When they ask us why we are helping—Jesus is the answer, but then what? God gives us all gifts and we believe it's important to recognize where we are lacking and partner with others who have strengths in areas where we do not.

Our desire is to help build a Ugandan non-denominational church, not an American church. We're looking for like minded Christians to partner with, that are willing to learn, as much as teach. We envision teams from local churches in the US visiting Nabisooto to provide spiritual as well as some financial support for the pastor and local community outreach. These would include seminars, bible studies for men and women, youth based projects, small business coaching and generally showing Christ's love in practical ways, all while respecting their local culture.

How would this work?

<u>You would</u>: Raise funding to build the brick building (phase 1). Help provide a very small salary for the local Ugandan pastor (partially funded). Provide ongoing spiritual support as well as committing to pray for the pastor and new congregation. In the future be willing to send teams to visit and perform outreach and service at this location in Uganda.

<u>ITFM would</u>: Provide presentation material, such as pictures and video for your fundraising efforts. Construct and build the facility. Perform the maintenance and upkeep of the building. Educate participants on the Ugandan way of thinking and culture. Help with initial outreach by leading US teams to Uganda. Provide the pastor with a micro-enterprise small business to assist with income generation. (solar based cell phone charging station in September). Have a Ugandan leader to oversee the pastor and church that will facilitate communication of needs and prayer requests. Provide initial housing for the pastor until permanent housing can be built on the local site. (see phase 2).

Process

There are several considerations that will affect the execution and timing of this project.

- 1. Weather: Ugandan seasons will determine the amount of work that can be accomplished in a given time period. During the rainy season it's not practical to have workers on site trying to build in extremely wet weather. So timing is key.
- 2. Security: We now have a lockable storage facility on site which allows **ITFM** to buy in bulk stockpiling cement and other necessary building materials and tools in order to complete the construction. So security of materials is better now but always must be considered.
- 3. Building Method: This building will be constructed using traditional locally available fired brick and mortar trucked to the site. See previous pictures of other projects at www.inthefieldministries.org
- 4. Staffing: This project requires searching for and hiring a local pastor/wife team in Uganda. (done)

5. Funding: This facility is funding dependent and it's necessary to raise enough money up front to ensure that we can have the roof installed as well as being able to securely lock the building before we can begin construction.

Where is Nabisooto?


Nabisooto will probably not be found on a map. It is located 35 kilometers Northwest of Kampala. We sit close to where these 3 counties meet, Luwero, Kiboga and Mubende.

We searched for land that had a close proximity to a paved road so it could easily be accessed in the rainy seasons. Nabisooto sits 5 kilometers off of the paved road.


On this 25 acres you can see many types of beautiful birds, plants and monkeys.

What is it going to look like?


Church / Multipurpose Building

Proposed Design

This is a concept drawing of the proposed church / multiple purpose building.
When funding allows, we will install the interior dividers made out of plywood and hung from the ceiling. The dividers can be moved to the exterior walls when the entire building needs to be opened up. Exterior doors are installed for use when the dividers are in place and smaller rooms needed for study groups, meetings etc.

This design is the draft and is open to change as we work with our Ugandan counterparts and contractor. The dividers in the space will allow for multi-use of the facility for bible studies or even a preschool during the week. The walls, floors and ceiling will be covered in cement stucco. The benches and stage will be made of wood. The building will be prepped and wired for electrical lighting even though currently there is no electricity in the village. This will save costs later when power arrives and also allow for the possibility of solar generated lighting in the short term or a future diesel generator for the entire site.

What's it going to cost?

Prices do vary and will fluctuate with the economy in Uganda and the current exchange rate. Also, this is construction, things do change, so costs are approximated. ITFM works very hard to keep costs down and stick to our budget. Please feel free to contact us with any questions or concerns.

How long will it take to construct?

The actual building should take 2-3 months to complete once funds are received.

When do you want to begin?

We are ready to begin at any time.

Who will build it?

A Ugandan contractor will be hired to run the job and workers. **ITFM** workers will manage the contractor and handle the purchasing and transport of materials.
