"Throw it out there & see what sticks" is our motto this week. The school in Nabisoto is growing and we are fighting to keep up. There are so many needy places in the world. Constantly we are opening the mail and finding organizations that need help. How do you choose? One thing we can tell you is that 100% of your donations go towards the projects in Nabisoto. ITFM has all it's expenses in the US covered. The donations we receive go directly to Uganda. No one in the US makes any salary from ITFM. The only people ITFM pays are the locals we hire in Uganda to run the school and clinic.

We understand times are tough. We appreciate the thought and prayer that goes into the donations that are made to In The Field. Our promise is to use those donations also with thought and prayer.

We accomplished much more than we planned to in 2014 and we have big ticket items on our wishlist for this year. We want to communicate what projects and programs we have going on. If we don't tell anyone then they will not get built and if we do not have goals, we will never reach them. So we are going to throw some big projects out there and see what sticks.

#1 We need another 2 classrooms built by the end of the year. Each classroom costs \$10,000 for 5th & 6th grade.

#2 We need more security fencing. With \$11,000, we would be able to fence the front and buy 2 gates. One section of fencing is already done.

#3 We have a great couple (Andrew and Victoria) moving out to Nabisoto long term next week. We need housing for them and any other workers that go there long term. This will cost about \$30,000. The site and design are already done for this. Housing is critical in this remote area.

#4+++ The kitchen will need expanding next year to accommodate the bigger pots and storage for the food. A new teacher housing unit needs to be built to house the new teachers from the next two school blocks that ITFM needs. All schools are required to have a testing facility. Schools are also required to have a soccer field and net ball area in order to be registered. Our soccer field needs a lot of work in order to be used. 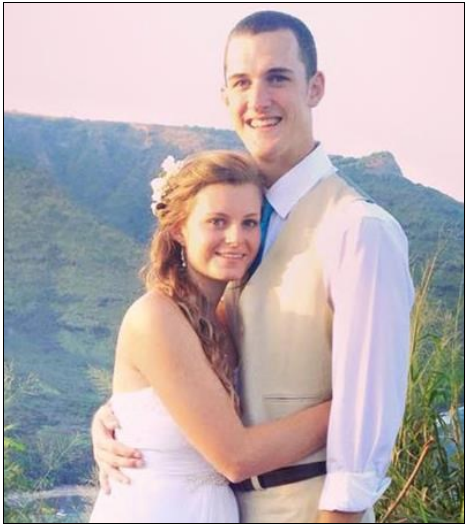

Maria does not have an answer. She cannot imagine herself anywhere but Nabisoto. She has no dreams of a better life and no joy in her daily routine. She has no hope now. There is still a chance for her grandkids to learn how to

do more than just survive. Education can turn their surviving into thriving. Together we can make that happen.
